## Park Features

**Water / Spray Park:** An appealing variety of water features.

**Playground:** Fully accessible space with an exciting range of play activities.

**Rain Garden:** Water treatment innovation that includes water-loving plants, habitat, visual appeal, colour, scent and texture.

**Wetland / Riparian Area:** Observation deck and interpretive signage at the natural wetland to view wildlife, habitat, plants and trees.

**Western Access Trails:** Trails that wind through the beautiful woodland from Government St. Great for cyclists, wheelchairs or strollers.

**Sports Courts:** For tennis and basketball; can also be used for in-line skating, road hockey etc.

**500 metre Loop Trail:** For runners, walkers, wheelchairs or strollers, this circle route will offer exercise and access throughout the park.

**Picnic Shelter:** Fully covered, it has accessible tables for picnics or visits with friends.

**Special Event Space:** A raised grass area for special occasions.

**Open Space:** For free unstructured play and seating during special events.

**Community Garden:** Continues to offer many colours, textures and scents.

**Lawn Bowling:** Continues to provide great exercise and entertainment.

**Seating:** Lots of benches in strategic locations to enhance park enjoyment.

**Beautification:** Planted flower beds at entry points. Landscaping will include all native species, with 30 mature red maple trees.
